Colonials Announce Schedule for 2008 Season

The Morris County Colonials schedule was announced today, giving the team 12 games through May June and July, with Regional and National finals running into the first week of August.

The Morris County team kick off their schedule at home to the Long Island Fury, before traveling to Bethlehem, PA to play the Pennsylvania Stoners, in a game which also has the inaugural Penn-Jersey Cup at stake. Next for the Colonials is a weekend road trip to take in Maine Sting and Boston Aztec, followed by Long Island away, before a run of four home games.

The Colonials' league season finishes with a trip to New York Athletic Club away. Competing in the other division of the Eastern conference are last years conference champions and national runners-up Queen City (Buffalo, NY), along with Atlantic City Diablos, certain to provide stiff competition in the regional playoffs.

Last years National Champions were SoCal Fusion, with the national finals played in San Diego. This season sees national finals played on Long Island, the local opportunity another incentive for the Colonials to go all the way in their first year.

"It's a challenging schedule", said Colonials Head Coach Adrian Borrows, "but our playing staff is looking in good shape, we've got some phenomenal players coming to the tryouts and I know we will be competitive".

Colonials have open tryouts are 12/22 and 12/29, with many top collegiate players and adults already registered for the opportunity to compete in the highest level of amateur soccer in the United States (full info on the team's website).

The Morris County Colonials team are part of the New Jersey Soccer Group of companies, that also includes WPSL franchise the Millburn Magic. The National Premier Soccer League (NPSL) is an open aged national league representing the highest level of amateur soccer in the United States.

The Colonials are playing in the Mid-Atlantic Division of the Eastern Conference, with regional and national finals following the conclusion of the domestic season.
